SCHEDULING PROCESS & TIMELINE

Scheduling will be a three-part process this year.

- PART I: SCHEDULING PRESENTATION FOR STUDENTS (FEB. 14TH)
- Receive evaluated transcript.
- Review graduation and A-G UC/CSU requirements.
- Discuss THS course offerings, curricular paths, dual enrollment, and CTE pathways.
- Receive instructions on how to submit course requests online using Naviance Course Planner.

- PART II:

 SELECTING CLASSES VIA

 NAVIANCE COURSE PLANNER
 (DEADLINE TO SUBMIT IS FEB 21ST)
 - Add course requests through Naviance Course Planner for the next school year during your online scheduling window.
 - Discuss course options with parents/guardians.
 - Click "submit for Approval" once you have added all your course requests.

PART III:
INDIVIDUAL MEETING WITH
COUNSELOR
(FEB 24TH - MAR 6TH)

- Students will meet with their counselor through their English class.
- Counselors will review submitted course requests, answer questions, and make suggestions where needed.

*EL and special education students will receive assistance in selecting classes by their EL coordinator or case carrier.



SCHEDULING BASICS



Sophomores are required to select 6 classes.

- 2 years minimum, 3 years recommended for A-G (Biology + Physical Science)



COURSE 4 MATH

- 2 years of math required for graduation.
- 3 years of math up to Algebra 2 required for A-G.
 - 4 years recommended.

For NEW athletes:

Must be eligible and complete clearance process. Certain sports may require students to tryout for the team. Select PE or Weight Training.

- 2. Dual enrollment classes offered at THS during the school year. Select courses of interest on Naviance.

 - Elementary Chinese Scheduled O period through 1st.
 - Fire Tech Scheduled O period
 - Child Growth and Development Scheduled O period

Q SUMMER SCHOOL







To make up classes for:

A-G eligibility (UC/CSU):

- Recommend making up any semester Ds to remain A-G eligible.
- Credit recovery program by invitation only

High school graduation:

- Recommend making up classes required for graduation.
- See list of summer programs posted on the counseling website or office.

*Before signing up for summer classes, we encourage you to talk to your counselor.

For advancement:

- Please complete the Summer School Notification Form and submit to the Counseling Office.
- Student will need to find an outside summer program and enroll themselves.
- Per board policy, students can only take 10 credits maximum in each core subject area through outside programs. 40 credits is the maximum.
