

History and Social Science - 3 years/30 credits (W. History, US History AND US Gov/Econ)

English - 4 Years/40 credits

Mathematics - 2 Years/20 Credits

Science - 1 Year/10 credits of Life Science/Biology <u>AND</u> 1 Year/10 Credits of Physical Science/Chemistry, ESS or Physics

World Language - 1 Year of World Language <u>OR</u> 1 Year of Fine Art

Fine Arts - See above

**Additional** - 2 Years of PE, 1 semester of Health <u>AND</u> 75 Elective Credits

6 semesters of composite S or E citizenship + 220 credits required for graduation

# csu/uc A - G Requirements



A. History and Social Science - 2 years (1 Year of W. History <u>AND</u> 1 Year of US History <u>OR</u> 1 Semester of US History AND 1 Semester of US Gov)

B. English - 4 Years

C. Mathematics - 3 Years Up to Algebra 2. 4 years recommended.

D. Science - 1 Year of Life Science (Biology) AND 1 Year of Physical Science (Chemistry, Earth & Space Science or Physics). 3 years is recommended.

E. World Language - 2 Years of the same World Language. 3 years recommended.

F. Visual Performing Art - 1 Year of a VPA in the same discipline

G. College Prep Elective - 1 Year of A-G approved elective

\* College entrance exams (SAT/ACT) may be required.

Passing grade of C or better.





### Planning Your Future

#### College & Career Center, A106

### Options after High School

#### **4 Year University**

- Must meet UC/CSU "A-G" College Entrance Requirements.
- Graduates from four-year colleges and universities are in greater demand by employers and generally earn more money than non-graduates.
- Tuition costs can be high, but financial aid and scholarship are available for all students.

#### 2 Year or Community College

- Open to everyone. High school diploma or GED is usually required.
- Relatively inexpensive and offer flexible class schedules.
- Can earn an A.A. or A.S degree.
- Transfer opportunities to a four-year school to get a B.A. or B.S.
- Honors Program

#### **Trade or Vocational Program**

- Provides practical "hands-on" training and prepares students for employment.
- The length of a program varies from several weeks to several years.
- Costs can also vary depending upon the length and quality of training.
- Make sure to check the program's accreditation.

#### **Employment**

What skills or training are required? Salary? Benefit?
 Opportunities for advancement?

#### Military

- Options include enlistment, military academies and Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) programs.
- Talk to area recruiter or College and Career Coordinator.


### Student Wellness
